



Bagging Procedures

It is important to follow specific steps to ensure that food items and other goods are protected during the fumigation process. Please note exactly which household items must be double-bagged in special MASTER FUME Bags, Nylofume® or Fumiguard® bags.

Sample items that must be bagged or removed from the structure being fumigated:

- Any food, feed, drugs and medicinals in glass, plastic or metal bottles, jars or cans where the original manufacturer's airtight seal has been broken.
- Bread, cereals, rice, cookies, crackers, pasta, chips and any other items packaged in plastic, paper or cardboard bags or boxes, even if they have never been opened.
- Beverages, snacks, candies, sauces, drugs, medicinals or other items in metallic foil-lined containers such as pouches, boxes or blister packs.
- Anything in resealable containers, including plastic containers, such as juice, milk, butter, sour cream and cottage cheese.
- Eggs, fruits, vegetables and any other forms of produce.
- Medicine, tobacco, vitamins and other ingestible pills, supplementals and lozenges.
- Pet food and animal feed in bags and boxes.
- Don't forget items in refrigerators and freezers!

Sample items that do not require bagging:

- Any food, feed, drugs (including tobacco products) and medicinals in glass or metal bottles, jars or cans with the original manufacturer's airtight seal intact
- Toothpaste, mouthwash, dental adhesives and dental whitening products
- Any shampoo and soaps
- Cosmetics, lotions and any other topical creams, oils and ointments
- Ice and water

IF IN DOUBT, TAKE IT OUT

Any products not listed above that may require protection should be bagged or removed from the structure being fumigated. If you have any questions about what does or doesn't require bagging, please contact your local professional pest management company.



How to use **MASTER FUME** polymer bags

Correctly used, MASTER FUME bags will protect food, feed, drugs and medicinals during the fumigation procedure.

MASTER FUME Bags are made from a special nylon polymer film. Research has shown these nylon bags to be effective at protecting ingestibles from MASTER FUME gas during fumigations when used one inside the other. The MASTER FUME Bags should be "doubled-bagged" (one bag placed inside the other) before you fill them with items that need protection. All items such as food, feed, drugs and medicinals not adequately packaged (including those items in refrigerators and freezers) must be removed from the structure being fumigated or sealed in the protective MASTER FUME Bags.

Don't forget items in refrigerators or freezers!

Place one empty MASTER FUME bag directly inside another.



Place items inside the inner bag. Do NOT overfill. Leave clearance on top for closure of the bags.



Twist top of inner bag, fold once, and secure fold in place using tape or a twist tie.



Repeat Step 3 with the outer bag.



Check the seal by pressing gently against the sides of the bag and listening for air escaping from the bag. **NO** air should be able to escape from the bag.

IMPORTANT: Keep these and all such bags out of reach of children.
